**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS BETWEEN  
CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS FOR DEPARTMENT  
ESTABLISHMENT, SHOULD THEY BE TIMELY WARRANTED**

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Irrigon has been elected to ensure Public Health, Welfare, and Safety, through various means and methods; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council understands that with each decision comes fiscal responsibilities and challenges during time of transition and with such action initial modification to existing structure need to take place to accommodate the addition and those certain agreements will need to be put into place; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council is committed to ensuring all members of the community have and are afforded such livability's; and

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRRIGON THAT THE CITY COUNCIL AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR AND CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO SUCH DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENTS THAT MAY NEED ACTION BETWEEN COUNCIL MEETINGS. SUCH AGREEMENTS MAY BE THE REMODELING OF LAW ENFORCEMENT SPACE AND SUCH EQUIPMENT LEASES.**




**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT THIS RESOLUTION IS EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE.**
