**Call to order/Pledge/Roll Call**

Mayor Michelle Patton called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Councilors present:** Mayor Michelle Patton, Hector Cano, Heather Bishop, Daren Strong, Melvin Lambert and Marlina Avila Serratos.

**Prearranged absence:** Mayor Pro-Tem Benji Calvert

**Staff present:** City Manager Aaron Palmquist and City Clerk Trista Seastone

**Audience present:** Ruth Bostick, Barbara Hulse, Tom Roberts, Jon Bass and Evan Purves

**Mayors Comments:**

Mayor Patton stated that she would be dropping off forms to the local schools for the annual “If I were mayor for the day” essay contest. This is a great opportunity for students from grades 1-12 to express what they would do as mayor, changes they would make, etc. Winners have a chance to go to a League of Cities meeting with Mayor Patton and a few other treats. Patton also discussed another contest that is being passed out to not only schools but is offered to all the residence of Irrigon. To rebrand the City of Irrigon a form can be completed and returned to City Hall. Mayor Patton welcomed the city’s first intern Evan Purves. Evan is a senior at Irrigon High School and has a desire to learn more about local government. This internship will assist Evan in fulfilling some requirements to graduate and assist him in gaining experience in government.

Mayor Patton wanted to thank Public Works staff for assisting in the clean-up of the parking lot located behind the Shell Gas Station and Rustic Truck restaurant. The parking lot had become littered with semi-trucks and trailers that were using the lot as long-term staging, making it nearly impossible for cars to access businesses and making it difficult for emergency vehicles to pass through if needed. City workers assisted in cleaning up overgrown brush, garbage and dismantled tents, tarps, outside shower and mattresses. These items were tucked within the parked semis and were not visible unless you were walking up behind them. City Code Enforcement assisted in tagging the trucks with warnings to move, signage was posted and the lot cleared out within a couple days. It was decided between management of the Shell Station and the Rustic Truck that there would be five (5) spaces allotted for semi-trucks that belong to residents inside city limits that are drivers using the lot as a temporary staging. Drivers will complete applications that are currently available at City Hall and a permit will be issued and displayed by the driver.

Michelle reminded council members and community members that she would be attending the League of Cities (LOC) conference from October 16-19<sup>th</sup>.

Barbara Hulse requested papers that she stated were signed 10 or more years ago regarding properties zoned residential to commercially zoned. Barbara stated that she was requesting to rebuild her home that burned down in 2023 and stated she had been advised that she would not be able to rebuild a residential home as the property is considered commercially zoned after her fire. Any new development would have to be a business but could have a living quarter above it. City staff responded stating that it might be worthwhile to talk to a developer about the cost of such a building, a way that could be lucrative for owner Barbara Hulse. Hulse also asked staff for advice on having an abandoned vehicle that had been left on her property. She stated that she had spoken to Code Enforcement and was under the impression it was being taken care of for her. Staff responded that the appropriate information on how to proceed would be forwarded to Hulse to follow through with.

Ruth Bostick asked the council if their microphones were working and that she was having a hard time hearing their responses and conversations. City councilors moved their microphones closer.

There were no further comments from the public.

Councilor Heather Bishop moved to accept and approve the Consent Agenda as presented.

City councilor Daren Strong seconded the motion.

Regarding the Sheriff Report enclosed in the council packet, Bishop asked staff if the nuisance calls in the report were from the same caller that was brought to the attention of City Council at the August meeting. Staff responded and stated that the date of the letter sent to the resident and the reports made were made prior to the letter being received.

**3. \*Final Acceptance for Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Project “#SRT23-05G001-T110420”**

The Safe Routes to School (SRTS) project is complete. Staff and J.U.B Engineers, the City Engineer of record, have recommended accepting the agreed contract requirements. Staff recommended accepting and authorizing the mayor to sign documents as needed.

City Councilor Melvin Lambert moved to accept the project as presented by J.U.B Engineers and authorize the mayor and city manager to sign accordingly.

Councilor Heather Bishop seconded the motion.

Councilor Hector Cano asked staff about the flashing school lights at A.C Houghton, stating that there needed to be more lights to warn drivers it was a school zone, and drivers need to slow down. Staff stated that it was being worked on with ODOT.

There was no further discussion

**4. \*ODOT IGA for US 730 ADA Curb Project**

The Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) was provided in the city council packet for review. The IGA outlines ODOT and the City of Irrigon’s responsibilities with and through the design and construction of the ADA Curb project.

City Councilor Daren Strong moved to authorize the Mayor and City Manager to sign the ODOT IGA as presented.

City Councilor Heather Bishop seconded the motion.

There was no discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

**5. \*Easements for ODOT US 730 ADA Curb Project**

The easement agreements with ODOT for ROW both permanent and temporary were provided in the council packet for review. The easements will provide ODOT temporary ability to work within the areas as noted and provide permanent easement to ODOT to maintain the installed ADA curb ramps. Permanent easements will be drafted following the final design and construction of the ADA ramps on the North side of US 730.

City Councilor Melvin Lambert moved to approve the easement agreements and authorize the mayor and city manager to sign.

City Councilor Heather Bishop seconded the motion.

There was no discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

**6. \*League of Cities Foundation Support Request**

The formal letter requesting donation from the League of Cities (LOC) was provided in the council packet for review. LOC is requesting donations from cities to assist in providing scholarships for those members that may need financial assistance to attend conferences such as the LOC Annual Conference, Oregon Mayors Conference and the LOC Spring Conference. Funds would also assist in training programs which include in person events, hybrid events and webinars.

City Councilor Daren Strong moved to approve \$250.00 to support the LOC Foundation which in turn assist local cities and their respective representatives on training opportunities.

City Councilor Melvin Lambert seconded the motion.

There was no discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

**7. \*Utility Easements with Stokes Senior Center and Burres Properties (NW Columbia Lane)**

A description of utility easement locations for city water and sewer, were included in the council packet for review. The utility easements would allow infrastructure to go across the Burres property 5 feet, and Stokes Landing Senior Center 15 feet. The city attorney is finalizing the documents to make sure correct and legal descriptions are noted. Both property owners have formally agreed to the proposed easement.

City Councilor Heather Bishop moved to approve the utility easement.

City Councilor Melvin Lambert seconded the motion.

There was no discussion.

Motion passed unanimously.

**8. \*Resolution 24-11 Adjusting Accounts Receivables on Utility Accounts**

Specific account information was provided to councilors in their packet for review. These accounts were reviewed by staff to see if there was any further collection action that could be taken on unpaid account balances. Balances are uncollectable as they were not included in a lien search when property was sold.

City Councilor Melvin Lamber moved to adopt Resolution 24-11 as presented and discussed in adjusting and writing off certain accounts in the amount of \$205.77.

City Councilor Daren Strong seconded the motion.

## City Manager Report 10-15-2024

While the season is changing the workloads and tasks performed also change, but there are no down or dull schedules. Much activity has been taking place by staff and various volunteers. Contractors for the city as well as private projects also are taking place as we have seen a slight downturn to interest rates. The best part of all the activity is that the community continues to see improvements both publicly and privately.

An area that too often gets forgotten is the Enhancement Grant opportunity. This is where each property can request up to \$2,000 every three (3) years to beautify and improve their respected properties and put some TLC in place. If anyone desires information the policy and application are located on the city web page or they may call city hall. We will work with each individual to get them to “yes” within the approved city policy.

The main event this month is the Trunk and Treat, sponsored by the Irrigon Chamber of Commerce. Games, treats hotdogs, and such will be from 4:00 – 6:00pm at the Irrigon Plaza. Between 4:00 – 8:00pm a haunted house event will again be held at the Irrigon Fire Department. Morrow County Unified Recreation provided resources toward major upgrades and opportunity for participants. Both events will be held on Thursday, October 31, 2024.

The Irrigon Library will be holding a Bazar, Bake, and Book sale on October 18-19, 2024. This is an annual event for the FOIL (Friends of the Irrigon Library) to raise funds for the library while also providing an opportunity to pick up some early holiday items.

Tonight, we have five (5) good motto suggestions for council action. Following such action staff will proceed forward to work toward options for logo drafting. Each participant is commended for dreaming of what is and could be regarding Irrigon.

Carla McLane has additional information regarding economic development and thoughts for the council to consider on the best opportunity use of lands. Such vision and decision-making should best position the city now and into the future, long after we are all gone.

Multiple items that may affect Irrigon have been recently discussed and/or addressed by Morrow County Commissioners. I highly recommend that actions be monitored.

Recently the Oregon Government Ethics Commission (OGEC) adopted rules regarding public meetings. They appear to place potential barriers on elected bodies. The LOC (League of Oregon Cities) is working to provide clarification language to the 2025 Legislative Session for clarification regarding executive sessions.

Housing is once again moving, slow but moving. Interest rates have dropped some and we have seen about four developments sell.

### **Court/Law Enforcement**

The court is working with the state to un-retain the city’s legal/law enforcement number. This will provide the judge opportunity to more effectively use the LEDS (law enforcement data systems) system when dealing and taking action on violations and with defendants.

Law enforcement continues to stay very busy, according to the data reports. This past month shows record numbers/hours but this is because MCSO has brought on several new deputies and they are in training, which requires direct supervision/operation before an individual goes solo.

Code enforcement continues to make positive progress. For those that have exhausted several attempts for compliance are being cited for various code violations. One in particular is the individual/property on SE Utah Ave. While there has been a citation it appears that more enforcement (citations) may be warranted.



## **Public Works (PW)**

A few of the projects (Food Pod, Incubator, and Housing Infrastructure) are scheduled to go out to bid this fall. We are hoping that the economy is receptive and bids come in at or below the engineer estimates.

With the growing concern of water quality, the city is required to have a Cross-Connection Program. This has been worked and being reviewed by OHA (Oregon Health Authority). The plan will be presented in November for adoption.

Additionally, our Water Conservation Plan needs updated according to OHA. This too is being updated by JUB (city engineers) for review by OHA and we are looking to presenting this in November or December for council adoption.

ODOT will be looking to install the ADA curb ramps at intersections on the north side of US 730. As previously mentioned, this has resulted from a multi-year law suit against ODOT. Their project is projected to go to bid in January or February of 2025.

Rock Enterprise has been working on a prototype solar street light. If all goes well staff are planning for installation will be reviewed with JUB at various locations along the south side of US 730, behind the sidewalk. These light units will be more decorative in nature than providing for light.

Over the last month striping has taken place. This effort has provided clearer distinction of which lane/side of the road to drive on. Several positive comments have been made regarding this safety improvement.

We are excited about a future splash park for Irrigon. Notification is to be officially made later this month by the Oregon State Parks Commission in which we anticipate grant documents should be ready for council action in October, but no later than November.

The Irrigon Food Pod project is being finalized and staff will review over the next couple of weeks to ensure a timely bidding process for this fall. The spring of 2025 is the anticipated construction start time.

Thank you for your patience as our public works staff work diligently to provide for the many services enjoyed in Irrigon.

## **Financial/Administration**

Evan Purves and the City Manager have had several opportunities to interact with and on other governmental meetings/opportunities. As he looks forward to pursuing a degree in Political Science (politics) these times are providing networking and broadening opportunities. Recently he was able to touch base with Representative Greg Smith.

This past month our billing printer sent out a wrong process, that should have gone out for another community. There is a lot of great information provided on the mailer that we are investigating the process and expense. We know it is not cheap but may be something to consider as it appears to provide clearer and more in-depth information. The back page information was wrong but all information on the front page of the mailings are correct per Irrigon account customers.

Participating by Zoom has now become a generally acceptable means for connecting to public meetings. Individuals present at the meeting in person are requested to speak up and speak slower so that those with hearing challenges. Using Zoom rename yourself by clicking on the three little dots in the upper right-hand corner of the Zoom screen. To address the council on a topic/question notify the City Clerk by 4:30 pm the day of the council meeting.

Anyone from the public needing assistance or questions contact City Hall. For councilors, contact me directly and we will provide the requested information on time. It is always best to ask questions and gather information from all perspectives. Staff and I thank you for your continued support.

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### OGEC Votes to Compromise Executive Session Confidentiality

By a unanimous vote, the Oregon Government Ethics Commission (OGEC) voted today to approve **administrative rules**

(<https://secure.sos.state.or.us/oard/displayDivisionRules.action?selectedDivision=709>)

that would erode the security of executive sessions by allowing virtual attendance by media. The LOC, other local government interests, and legislators offered comments to the OGEC in opposition to the provision, but that input was disregarded. While the commission did have questions about the rule, discussion was directed through the OGEC staff and no experts on public meetings law were part of the discussion. **The LOC is advising its members to disallow virtual attendance of any party at executive sessions in which media are allowed to attend.**

The LOC will be seeking a legislative remedy in 2025 on this individual matter as well as the addition of local government representatives on the OGEC.

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# Oregon Government Ethics Commission

## Chapter 199

### Division 40

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

199-040-0015

##### Commencement and Adjournment of an Executive Session

The purpose of this rule is to clarify when an executive session begins and ends.

(1) An executive session is a meeting or part of a meeting of a governing body which is closed to certain persons for deliberations on certain matters. Governing bodies must deliberate in meetings open to the public unless the governing body has publicly identified the statutory authorization in ORS 192.660 or other lawful basis for closing the meeting to certain persons.

(2) The public announcement of the statutory authorization or other lawful basis for the executive session must be made prior to entering the executive session. If an executive session only will be held, or if the executive session precedes a meeting open to the public, the announcement must be made in a properly issued meeting notice. If an executive session is held in conjunction with a regular, special or emergency meeting of the governing body, the announcement must be made during the portion of the meeting that is open to the public.

(3) An executive session ends when the meeting ceases to be closed to the public. If a public meeting will be held again after the executive session, the governing body must use reasonable means to give actual notice to interested persons that the meeting is again a public meeting.

##### Permitted and Prohibited Topics for Executive Session

(1) The purpose of this rule is to clarify that an executive session may only be held when permitted by a specific provision of ORS 192.660 or other state law authorizing an executive session. The topic(s) discussed in an executive session must be limited to those topics expressly permitted by the specific provision(s) under which the executive session was convened. Members of governing bodies may not discuss topics in executive session other than those delineated in ORS 192.660 or other state law permitting an executive session, even if the additional topics are related to the issue concerning which the governing body convened the executive session.

(2) Each prerequisite and requirement of the specific provision of ORS 192.660 must be met before an executive session may be convened under that provision.

(3) Compensation, including salaries and benefits, must not be discussed or negotiated during an executive session under ORS 192.660(2)(a), (b) or (f).

Example: City A interviews candidates for the position of city manager in an executive session held under ORS 192.660(2)(a). The governing body wishes to discuss non-salary compensation with the candidates, including access to a city vehicle and membership in a professional organization. This is not a topic permitted in executive session.

Complaints

(1) The purpose of this rule is to clarify procedures regarding the opening of one or more preliminary reviews based on a complaint of violations of ORS 192.660 made against member(s) of a governing body.

(2) Attendance at any executive session by a member of the governing body will be considered participation in the executive session.

(3) When the Director makes a determination to open a preliminary review based on a complaint alleging violations of ORS 192.660 by one or more members of a governing body, the Director will open preliminary reviews on each member of the governing body who the Director has reason to believe participated in the executive session at issue, even if all of the participating members of the governing body are not named or identified in the original complaint. Any preliminary reviews against members of the governing body not named or identified in the original complaint will be opened as soon as practicable based on available information. If the Director receives subsequent information that names or identifies additional members of the governing body who participated in the executive session at issue, preliminary reviews will be opened on them as soon as practicable.

Employment of a Public Officer, Employee, Staff Member or Individual Agent under ORS 192.660(2)(a) and Compliance with ORS 192.660(7)(d)

(1) The purpose of this rule is to provide guidance to a governing body when the governing body holds an executive session permitted by ORS 192.660(2)(a): "To consider the employment of a public officer, employee, staff member or individual agent." Only consideration of an initial employment is permissible under this section. ORS 192.660(2)(a) does not authorize discussion of other employment actions such as performance evaluation, complaints, discipline, termination, or extension of an employment contract.

(2) Before a governing body convenes an executive session to consider initial employment of a chief executive officer, public officer, employee or staff member under ORS 192.660(2)(a), the governing body must fulfill the prerequisites listed in ORS 192.660(7)(d). ORS 192.660(7)(d) requires that the public body:

(a) Advertise the vacancy;

(b) Adopt regular hiring procedures;

(c) In the case of an officer, offer the public an opportunity to comment on the employment of the officer; and

(d) In the case of a chief executive officer, the governing body must have adopted hiring standards, criteria and policy directives in meetings open to the public in which the public has had the opportunity to comment on the standards, criteria and policy directives.

(3) When a governing body convenes an executive session to consider the employment of an agent under ORS 192.660(2)(a), the agent must be an individual person. Some examples may include an attorney, an accountant, or another individual who would perform services on behalf of the public body in the capacity of an agent, even if the prospective individual agent works for a larger firm or company. A firm or business entity that consists of more than one person is not an individual agent, and a governing body shall not consider the employment of a firm or entity in executive session under this section. It is not required that the governing body fulfill the prerequisites listed in ORS 192.660(7)(d) when considering the employment of an individual agent in executive session under ORS 192.660(2)(a).

Notice to Public Official under ORS 192.660(2)(b) or (i)

(1) In order to afford to the chief executive officer of any public body, a public officer, employee, staff member or individual agent the opportunity to request an open hearing under ORS 192.660(2)(b) or (i), the public official must receive written notice of the meeting no less than one business day or 24 hours, whichever is greater, in advance of the meeting.

(2) At a minimum, the written notice shall include:

(a) Identification of the governing body before which the matter will be considered;

(b) The time, date and location of the meeting;

(c) The purpose for which the governing body proposes to convene the executive session, including the citation to the applicable section of ORS 192.660 and the fact that the governing body will be considering the dismissal or disciplining of, hearing complaints or charges against, or reviewing and evaluating the performance of the public official receiving the notice;

(d) Information on how the public official may make a request for an open hearing.

Consultation with Legal Counsel

(1) The purpose of this rule is to provide guidance to governing bodies when the governing body holds an executive session permitted by ORS 192.660(2)(h): "To consult with counsel concerning the legal rights and duties of a public body with regard to current litigation or litigation likely to be filed."

(2) In order to meet the requirements for an executive session permitted by ORS 192.660(2)(h), the attorney with whom the governing body is consulting must be present at the executive session, either in person or by telephone or by other concurrent means of oral or video electronic communication.

**115 Amends Constitution; Authorizes impeachment of statewide elected officials by Oregon Legislature with two-thirds vote by each house; establishes process.**

**Result of "Yes" Vote:** "Yes" vote authorizes and establishes a process for the Oregon Legislature to impeach statewide elected officials; House initiates impeachment with two-thirds vote; Senate tries and convicts with two-thirds vote; Chief Justice of Oregon Supreme Court oversees impeachment trial.

**Result of "No" Vote:** "No" vote retains current law that does not authorize the Oregon Legislature to impeach and remove statewide elected officials.

**Summary:** Amends the Oregon Constitution to grant the Oregon House of Representatives the power to impeach statewide elected officials in the executive branch, and to grant the Oregon Senate the power to try an impeachment received from the House. Currently, the statewide elected officials of the executive branch are the Governor, the Secretary of State, the State Treasurer, the Attorney General and the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries. At present, the only way to remove these officials is through recall election. The measure permits the House to impeach for malfeasance, corrupt conduct in office, willful neglect of constitutional duty or other felony or high crime. Requires "yes" vote of at least two-thirds (40) of Representatives to send impeachment resolution to Senate. Requires Senate to conduct impeachment trial and requires "yes" vote of at least two-thirds (20) of Senators to convict. The Chief Justice of the Oregon Supreme Court would preside over an impeachment trial. A convicted official is removed from office and disqualified from other public office.

**Estimate of Financial Impact:** This measure amends the constitution to allow the House of Representatives to impeach statewide elected officials. The measure requires the Senate to try any impeachment received from the House. The Chief Justice presides over the trial. The financial impact on state government is indeterminate because impeachment trials do not have a set length and could happen outside of regularly scheduled sessions. There is no fiscal impact on local governments.

**116 Amends Constitution; Establishes "Independent Public Service Compensation Commission" to determine salaries for specified officials; eliminates legislative authority to set such salaries**

**Result of "Yes" Vote:** "Yes" vote amends Oregon Constitution to establish a commission to determine salaries paid by state to specified officials, replacing current practice of establishing such salaries by legislation; provides that determinations of the commission are automatically funded.

**Result of "No" Vote:** "No" vote retains current law whereby salaries paid by state to specified officials are established by legislation.

**Summary:** Under current law, the salaries paid by the state to many public officials are set by statute and can be changed only through legislation. This measure authorizes establishment of a body named the Independent Public Service Compensation Commission to determine salaries paid by the state to the Governor, the Secretary of State, the State Treasurer, the Attorney General, the

Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries, judges of the Supreme Court, judges of other courts under the administration of the judicial branch of state government, state Senators, state Representatives and district attorneys. Determinations of the commission would not be subject to review or modification by the Legislative Assembly, the Governor or any other official. The measure provides that the membership of the commission is to be established by law, except that the following classes of individuals are ineligible for membership: officers and employees of the state, lobbyists, and immediate family members of such officers, employees and lobbyists. The measure provides that moneys sufficient to pay for the commission's salary determinations are automatically appropriated from the General Fund without the need for a further appropriation by law.

**Estimate of Financial Impact:** This measure amends the Constitution to create a Commission responsible for deciding the salaries of certain elected officials. The money for the salaries will come from the General Fund. The measure itself does not decide the moneys needed to cover the salaries. The fiscal impact to the state, for chosen salaries and commission staff, could not be determined. There is no fiscal impact on local governments.

**117 Gives voters option to rank candidates in order of preference; candidate receiving majority of votes in final round wins**

**Result of "Yes" Vote:** "Yes" vote gives voters the option to rank candidates in order of preference for specified federal and statewide offices. Establishes process for tallying votes in rounds, with the candidate receiving the fewest votes in each round being defeated and votes for the defeated candidate going to the voter's next-highest ranked active candidate. Requires that candidate must receive majority of votes in final round of voting to win election.

**Result of "No" Vote:** "No" vote maintains current voting system. Voter selects one candidate for federal and statewide offices. Candidate with most votes wins. Majority of votes not required for candidate to win election.

**Summary:** Current state law requires voters to select only one candidate for each office on the ballot. The candidate with the most votes after a single vote tally wins, even if not a majority. This measure gives voters the option to rank candidates in order of preference using "ranked choice voting." Under the measure, voters may choose to rank only one candidate or multiple candidates for each office, as well as write in candidate(s). Votes are counted toward each voter's highest-ranked candidate. If no candidate receives a majority of votes, votes are tallied automatically in rounds. The candidate receiving the fewest votes in each round is defeated. A defeated candidate's votes go to the voter's next highest-ranked candidate. The process continues until one candidate has a majority of votes. The measure applies to the nomination and election of President, United States Senator, Representative in Congress, Governor, Secretary of State, State Treasurer and Attorney General, and election of the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries. The measure requires the Secretary of State to establish a program to educate voters about how ranked choice voting elections will be conducted. Authorizes local governments to adopt ranked choice voting for elections for local offices. Local governments that adopted ranked choice voting before 2025 may continue to use current method or modify it. The measure applies to elections beginning in 2028.

**Estimate of Financial Impact:** This measure establishes ranked choice voting for federal, state, and some local elected offices. The Secretary of State must create rules for carrying out ranked choice voting and educate voters about ranked choice voting. The Secretary of State and County Clerks must present two reports to interim legislative committees by September 15, 2026. If the measure is passed by Oregon voters, ranked choice voting must be effective by January 1, 2028.

The measure is estimated to cost the state government \$0.9 million during the 2023-25 biennium. This cost is to pay for needed staff and consulting services for the Secretary of State to begin carrying out the measure. In the 2025-27 biennium, the cost of the measure is estimated to grow to \$5.6 million. This is to continue funding staff and consulting services, as well as outreach and IT needs.

The cost of the measure is less known for local government. County Clerks estimate that the measure will cost \$2.3 million initially. This funding will be used to improve technology, train staff, and test the new system. Every statewide election will cost an additional \$1.8 million for added printing and logistics. Software and maintenance contract costs will cost an additional \$0.4 million per year.

**118 Increases highest corporate minimum taxes; distributes revenue to eligible individuals; state replaces reduced federal benefits**

**Result of "Yes" Vote:** "Yes" vote increases corporate minimum tax on Oregon sales exceeding \$25,000,000; eliminates tax cap; distributes revenue to eligible individuals; state replaces any reduced federal benefits.

**Result of "No" Vote:** "No" vote retains existing corporate minimum taxes on Oregon sales; twelve tax brackets impose different tax amounts, capped at \$100,000 tax on sales exceeding \$100,000,000.

**Summary:** Current law requires corporations to pay higher of either tax on taxable income or corporate minimum tax. Except S corporations, minimum tax amount determined by tax bracket based on corporation's Oregon sales; minimum tax capped at \$100,000 for \$100,000,000 or more in sales. Beginning 2025, measure removes minimum tax cap; increases minimum tax on all corporations with Oregon sales exceeding \$25,000,000 by imposing additional tax of 3% for sales above \$25,000,000. Measure directs Department of Revenue to equally distribute increased revenue (minus certain costs) to all individuals residing more than 200 days annually in Oregon. Revenue distribution does not affect individual eligibility for state benefits; measure requires replacement of reduced federal benefits if distribution negatively affects individual's benefits under any need-based program. Other provisions.

**Estimate of Financial Impact:** The measure establishes a new gross receipts tax as the minimum tax for certain corporations. According to the Legislative Revenue Office, indirect economic costs of the measure include a 1.3 percent increase in prices of goods and services and reductions in jobs, wages and personal incomes. Corporate tax revenues are estimated to increase by \$1.3 billion in 2023-25, \$14.7 billion in 2025-27, and \$15.6 billion in 2027-29.

New revenue raised will be used to issue annual rebates to eligible individuals in Oregon. An estimated \$13.6 billion will be required for rebate distributions in 2025-2027 and an estimated \$17.1 billion will be required in 2027-29. Administrative costs and any additional payments will be deducted from the amount to be distributed.

Known administrative costs are estimated to be

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**Measure 118 Continued**

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\$1.6 million General Fund and 22 permanent positions in the 2023-25 biennium and \$48.2 million General Fund and 199 additional permanent positions in the 2025-27 biennium at the Oregon Department of Revenue. The measure will generate a significant workload increase processing applications for the rebate, verifying the identity and eligibility of those applying for the rebates, reviewing payments and tax refunds for fraudulent activity, handling appeals, increasing customer inquiries, increasing audit and collections activity for the new tax, and increasing technology programming. Other major expenses are unknown but could be significant for expenses such as payments for rebate checks, prepaid debit cards, mailings associated with the program, legal fees, and public information costs.

Individuals who lose federal benefits because of the rebate will be held harmless with additional payments. The costs associated with this provision are unknown. Rebates that are declined by eligible individuals will be available to fund services for senior citizens, health care, and public early childhood education through high school. The impact from these declined rebates is unknown.

Following the initial phase-in, total biennial costs of the rebate program are expected to exceed the new biennial revenue. Estimated indirect impacts on personal income tax revenue are reductions of \$12 million in 2023-25, \$199 million in 2025-27, and \$207 million in 2027-29. Lastly, changes to the economy are projected to reduce state revenue by roughly \$11 million in 2023-25, \$150 million in 2025-27 and \$400 million in 2027-29.

The corporate kicker will increase by an estimated \$1.3 billion in 2025-27, and transfers to the Rainy Day Fund from the General Fund will be reduced.

Impact to local governments is unknown.

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**Proposed by Initiative Petition**

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**119 Cannabis retailers/processors must remain neutral regarding communications to their employees from labor organizations; penalties**

**Result of "Yes" Vote:** "Yes" vote requires cannabis retailers/processors to agree to remain neutral when labor organizations communicate with employees about collective bargaining rights; licensure/certification penalties possible.

**Result of "No" Vote:** "No" vote retains current labor laws; no requirement that cannabis retailers/processors agree to remain neutral on communications between their employees and labor organizations.

**Summary:** Current law generally guarantees employees' rights to organize and collectively bargain. Measure requires agreement between cannabis retailers/processors and a labor organization that meets the definition of labor organization under the National Labor Relations Act and whose operations are independent of the retailer/processor. At minimum, agreement must require that retailer/processor will remain neutral when labor organization representatives communicate with employees about collective bargaining rights. Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission must require such signed agreement or attestation of such agreement, in addition to existing licensure or certification requirements for cannabis retailers/processors. Failure to have a signed agreement or attestation, or to follow the agreement, may result in penalties, including fines or the denial, suspension, or revocation of retailer's/processor's license or certificate.

**Estimate of Financial Impact:** This measure will increase state government costs by approximately \$0.6 million in the first year. Ongoing costs will increase by approximately \$0.8 million each subsequent year. The estimated costs include six new positions to verify application documents and monitor compliance. The increased costs will be paid for by license application fees. There is no financial impact to local governments.

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**CITY OF BOARDMAN**

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**Measure 25-103 City of Boardman New Home Rule Charter**

**Question:** Shall the City adopt a new home rule Charter replacing the current Charter?

**Summary:** The Oregon Constitution grants City voters the right to adopt home rule charters. Charters grant legal authority to cities and assign duties to city officials. This measure would adopt a new home rule Charter for the City of Boardman and replace the current Charter, which was enacted in 1985.

The City Council referred the new Charter to the voters on the recommendation of a Charter Review Committee.

The new Charter is based on the League of Oregon Cities Model Charter but keeps provisions unique and important to Boardman.

The proposed Charter is updated and modernized to more clearly define the legal authority of the City and:

- Retains the current form of government with a Mayor and six councilors
- Sets additional qualifications for elected officials
- Allows for removal of a councilor for certain actions
- Clarifies the process for filling council vacancies and tie votes
- Removes debt limits and requires debt limits to conform with state law
- Removes city recorder from appointive offices

The proposed Charter also contains additional changes.

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**NORTH MORROW VECTOR CONTROL DISTRICT**

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**Measure 25-102 Four-Year Local Option Levy Renewal for Vector (Mosquito) Control**

**Question:** Shall the District impose .10 per \$1,000 of assessed value for mosquito control operations for four years beginning 2025-26? "This measure renews current local option taxes."

**Summary:** The North Morrow Vector Control District will use the tax revenue from this measure to provide improvements to and also maintain general operations, including the following:

- Improve response time to West Nile virus and other emerging mosquito-borne diseases for example.
- Maintain the utilization of aircraft for mosquito control operations.
- Improve outreach programs and public education efforts.
- Increase the utilization, and upgrade available technology for mosquito control operations.
- Maintain vehicle and equipment replacement.

The proposed levy will raise approximately \$300,000 annually over 4 years for a total of \$1,200,000. This estimate is based on the best available information from the Morrow County Assessor, and is an ESTIMATE ONLY. This levy would cost the owner of property an estimated value of \$300,000, \$30.00 per year. This option levy is not a new tax increase, but a continuation of the prior option levy.

RE: Employment Lands – Next Steps

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**So how does Irrigon create more employment land?** The City of Irrigon updated its Comprehensive Plan nearly four years ago including Goal 9 Economics. At the time there was not a clear path for how Irrigon might want to establish a stronger economic base. Is that changing? And what next steps are necessary to address future economic growth for the community?

Oregon is governed, as you well know, by the statewide land use planning program. Goal 9 Economics requires that the state work “to provide adequate opportunities throughout the state for a variety of economic activities vital to the health, welfare, and prosperity of Oregon's citizens.” Irrigon’s Goal 9 similarly states that Irrigon will work “to diversify and improve the economy of Irrigon.” To address Goal 9 the state has in place requirements that communities wanting to either expand their urban growth boundary (UGB) or convert other lands to employment lands (commercial or industrial) they complete an Economic Opportunities Analysis (EOA) to determine, in economic terms, the supply and demand for those types of lands. The City of Hermiston is completing this process currently working to add 1,500 acres to their UGB for large lot data center development. The City of Boardman is just getting this process underway with a more generic approach knowing that additional employment lands are necessary but taking a more conservative approach and while looking to a UGB expansion also looking to redevelop lands inside the city limits.

**What is an EOA, what might it cost, how long will it take, and who does them?** The Department of Land Conservation and Development defines an EOA as follows: “An Economic Opportunity Analysis is like an economic forecast for an area: it equips cities with information to help prepare for growth over time. These analyses help cities and counties understand which industries and services will thrive in their area, and how they can best use land within their urban growth boundaries (UGB).” While I do not know what the City of Hermiston has expended for their process the City of Boardman has committed nearly \$100,000 for the development of an EOA. As part of the EOA process a Public Advisory Committee, or PAC, will be formed to provide insight and guidance to the process, the contractor will evaluate Goal 9 of the Comprehensive Plan to be sure that the policies are adequate to support the desired outcomes related to employment lands, and the EOA will outline the various supply and demand scenarios for the City of Irrigon. Once a contractor is selected the process generally takes about nine months to complete and should result in an expansion of the UGB or a change in zoning of lands to support economic development, or both. There are several firms in Oregon that specialize in EOAs with some doing extensive work in Eastern Oregon.

**What type of economic opportunities is Irrigon interested in? Can city infrastructure support employment lands development?** There are a lot of questions that need to be considered as the City

Council moves forward with this discussion. Economic development has often been left to the Port of Morrow. Can that change? Should it? The types of development at the Port of Morrow to the west of Irrigon includes food processing, data centers, and other industries with smaller footprints. Are there new opportunities that Irrigon could develop? How would food processing or data center development be welcomed to our community? Can economic development be done in a way that would be beneficial to the community? Does the city have adequate infrastructure to support these types of development? Many of these questions can and will be answered through an EOA as well as many others.

**Your mission if you choose to accept it:** With your consensus staff would next work to develop a simple Scope of Work and Request for Proposals to engage the various firms with expertise in EOAs with experience in Eastern Oregon for selection to engage in an EOA. An RFP could reasonably be deployed before January 1<sup>st</sup> with a contractor working on an EOA before April 1, 2025, possibly sooner.

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The City of Irrigon only received two (2) eligible bids and opened as noted in the public procurement process. JUB Engineers has provided a breakdown of the bids along with their engineer estimate.

The Lift Station and generator are part of the broader SB1530 Housing Infrastructure Project. These two items were scheduled first as they have between a three- and four-month lead time for manufactures to design, build and deliver. Once they arrive, we should have the main infrastructure project underway. In accordance with the contract scheduled all expenditures are to be completed by June 30, 2025. With this in mind we are making forward progress to achieve that scheduled date.

There were two (2) bidders, the lowest noted and public bidder, Pump Tech, LLC and Romtec Utilities, Inc., complies with the noted requirements as set forth in the bidding documents.

Staff recommends acceptance of JUB Engineers recommendation of award for the City of Irrigon – Advanced Lift Station Project to Pump Tech for \$149,850.00 pre-packaged station and Romtec Utilities for \$54,375.00 back-up generator as presented and authorizing the Mayor and City Manager to sign contract documents.

The project had two independent base bids. There were two bidders on the project: PumpTech LLC, and Romtec Utilities Inc. The bid tabulation is attached. The total prices are summarized as follows:

RE: Oregon State Parks – “Splash Park Grant Agreement” - Item #6

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In February 2024 the City Council passed Resolution 24-01 for making application to the Oregon Parks and Recreation for a grant to construct a 'splash park'. On September 24, 2024 the City of Irrigon was notified that we were approved by the Oregon Parks and Recreation Commission.

This project has been a long-standing desire and benefit for the community. We are excited for this one million grant award and look forward to seeing the project completed. The estimated timeline is for our city engineers (JUB) begin gathering and designing various aspects to be ready for public bidding in the fall of 2025. Project construction would then be ready to begin in 2026, upon a successful contract award.

In the current process the grant agreement between the City of Irrigon and Oregon Parks and Recreation, as approved by the Oregon DOJ (Department of Justice) needs to be finalized.

Staff recommends that mayor and city manager be authorized to execute the Splash Park agreement and required documents.
